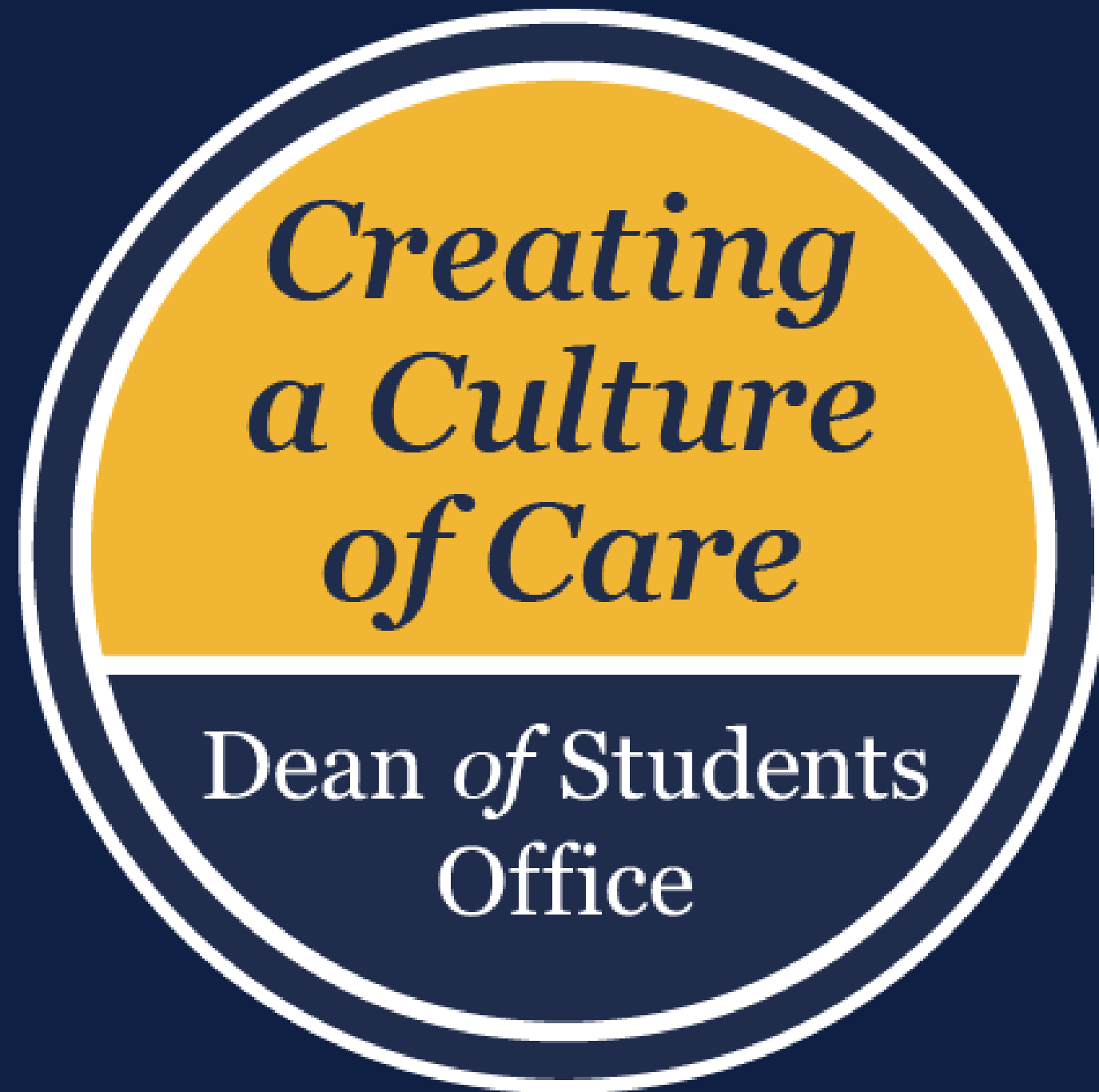

What is the Dean of Students Office?



The mission of the Dean of Students Office is to initiate **learner-centered** programs and services that foster a **culture of care** conducive to academic and personal development.

When might you interact with the Dean of Students Office?

If you reach out to us because...

- You are experiencing personal difficulty and need to be connected to resources
- You are not sure where to go to find the answer to your question and need a place to start
- You are concerned about the wellbeing of another student

If we reach out to you because...

- Someone in the campus community reached out to us out of concern for your wellbeing.

 - Family/Friends

What do you need to know about the Dean of Students Office?
